The location is at the Bowl and Pitcher Group Campground, Riverside State Park, Spokane, WA. This new group camp area is located right next to the Spokane River, with the upriver tent area reserved for our use (up to 60 people) plus 7 individual hookup sites (water & electricity), along with a new restroom/shower facility. Day visits are free and tent areas are \$2 per person per night; utility sites are \$20 per site per night, with extra vehicles at the site \$6 per night. Day use is free. Since the number of utility sites is limited to 7, please reserve your site by sending the first night's \$20 fee to KBARA, PO Box 18575, Spokane WA 99228-8575.

Directions: From Interstate 90, take the Maple Street Bridge exit #280. Travel north across the Maple Street Bridge. At the Maxwell St. traffic light, about one mile from the bridge, turn left (west). Follow Maxwell St. as it winds westward, and then northward as it becomes Pettit Drive. It later becomes the Abrey L. White Parkway. The Downriver Golf Course will be on the right, and Riverside State Park just beyond. The Bowl and Pitcher Campground is about two miles north of the park entrance. Signs inside the park will direct you to the KBARA campsites. Special thanks to our President Betsy, N7WRQ, for making the initial arrangements!

Butch On Mars *KE7MBL*

In 1967, the 60 MARS stations in Vietnam made 285,000 phone patches and handled over 600,000 other types of messages. During 1968, the Air Force Commo systems, a MARS net with 13 stations in Vietnam and 10 in Thailand, handled 268,512 transmissions of which 172,838 were patches and 26,570 were from military personnel and civilians in Vietnam. These were handled also by Ham Ops here in the states.
