

Hamfest 2016 by Betsy, N7WRQ

Hi All,

Again, thanks to everyone who helped make Spokane Hamfest 2016 happen. It was another good year for meeting our goals with this most important Ham Radio event hosted by the six clubs.

Here's the recap of our wrap-up meeting, held October 18,2016.

1. Our Treasurer Mike, KE7PG, presented his report: this year, we had 400 paid admissions, sold 1,577 raffle tickets, spent \$1,827 on prizes (includes all raffle & door prizes and rebates on radios). The bank account totaled \$3,915. With about \$40 left in the account to keep it open, each of the five clubs received their donated seed money of \$500 plus \$275 in profit.

2. Regarding next year's event, Mike, KE7PG stipulated there must be a cut-off date for reserving swap tables, that the total number of swap tables be limited to 40-45 to make the Commons area more accessible to wheelchairs, and that he be the contact person for the Hamfest. With that agreed upon by the Hamfest Committee, he volunteered to again be the Treasurer of the event. Thanks so much Mike!!!

3. Discussions regarding the date of next year's event followed, as well as whether to change prices. It was determined that September 23, 2017 would be the date of Spokane Hamfest 2017, and that all prices would remain the same. In addition, the Hamfest Committee determined that any











club contributing seed money but not participating in the event would receive their seed money back after the Hamfest, but without any profit. Too, we discussed whether it would be better to have a number of less expensive raffle prizes, rather than including an expensive one.

4. Our next meeting will be held January 10, 2017, 5:30PM at Zip's Restaurant (corner of Trent & Fancher in the Spokane Valley). At that meeting, seed money will be expected from each club, with the maximum to be put in by each limited to \$500.

5. Over the next several weeks, University High School will be reserved for the event, and the application for ARRL WA State Convention status will be applied for.

So, again, thanks all, & onward!!



Satellite Update


Our two popular FM satellites are continuing to function well. 13 year old SO-50 and the celebrating a year in orbit, AO-85.



<u>SO-50</u>

Mode V/u FM Transponder - 250 mw VHF Uplink: 145.850 MHz FM - 67.0 hz tone UHF Downlink: 436.795 MHz FM

Use a 74.4 hz tone to turn the satellite on if need be. Once the satellite is on be sure and transmit with the 67.0 hz tone.



AO-85

Mode U/v FM Transponder - 400 mw plus UHF uplink: 435.180 MHz FM - 67.0 hz tone VHF downlink: 145.980 MHz FM



SHERPA Mission Delayed

The first flight of the SHERPA cubesat launch system was originally to be launched late this year. Due to the unfortunate pre-launch fueling fire that SpaceX suffered causing the loss of a communications satellite this has been pushed back until next year. SHERPA will have the capability of launching multiple cubesats. Among the first cargo are to be new Fox satellites from the on going AMSAT NA Fox series, Fox-1Cliff and Fox-1D.

The next Fox satellite to be launched sill be RadFxSat (Fox-1B). Currently set for March 16, 2017 from Vandenberg AFB atop a Delta II rocket. This satellite carries an FM transponder similar to AO-85.

It covers an area from northeastern Washington to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system is also part of the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in western Washington and Oregon. The primary purpose of the KBARA repeaters is to provide a means for emergency communications within the above areas, and secondarily for routine radio traffic. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage, extending the limited range provided by any single repeater operation. The KBARA FM repeaters operate in the VHF bands and are linked by UHF radios. All licensed Amateur Radio operators are welcome to use this open repeater system.
