

Experience counts, if you "old timers" have some ideas please pass them along EVERY BODY IS WELCOME!


I would like to remind everyone that it is not the net controls that make the net, it is the participants with their comments, opinions and wisdom that make it a success.



ach morning during the 7:00 AM KBARA net we hear from Sally, N7ZJN at heney, WA and her morning "Bridgett Report".

Sally Casey was born Sally L. Alesse in December, 1925 in Buffalo, New York. Her father was of Italian descent and her mother Irish. Of course she grew up in the Catholic faith. Her father was a laborer and her mother was busy as a homemaker. There we 3 brothers in the family, 1 older and 2 younger. In 1930 the family moved out of town several miles onto a single lot with no power, water or inside plumbing. In fact for several months they lived in a tent and then managed a "tar paper shack" with a dirt floor. It would be 7 years before they had power and water. As time went on, Sally's father gradually obtained more property around their place, growing to 10 acres. Years later the area became an upper class neighborhood development. The last parcel became part of a strip mall. Sally started working at an early age as a maid for wealthy families. She continued with school and graduated from High School in 1943. She worked full time for a year as a waitress and in a commercial

laundry to earn her way through college. She graduated from Buffalo State Teachers College in 1948 with a degree in Elementary and Special education. In 1950 she earned her Masters of Education degree in reading and guidance from Oregon State. Sally did more post graduate work, completing enough for her Doctorate, but the requirements kept changing and she never got the final degree. So we can't call her "Dr. Sally".

A major part of her Masters program was the writing of a booklet for parents entitled "Ways You Can Help Your Child with Reading". Sally is justifiably proud of this as it was printed and reprinted again to as many as 500,000 copies and used for years in school districts around the country. Sally taught and provided speech therapy for a full career in several states. Oregon, Indiana, Colorado, Illinois, and Washington. She retired from Spokane School District 81 in 1985.

Sally married John Casey in 1947 and helped support him through graduate training as he earned his doctorate. Dr. John Casey later became a professor at Eastern Washington University in Cheney where they moved in 1956. They divorced in 1981. There were two boys, Brian lives in Neptune, New Jersey, is married and has 2 children. A younger son, Sean died suddenly in 1998. Sally has done a great deal of volunteer work over the years going clear back to when she remembered sewing a Campfire uniform for another girl who had none.

Sally tells of being aware of Amateur Radio for a long time and even took a class years ago but was sort of intimidated by the code requirements at the time and so never too the exam. Later, when code requirements were dropped for the Technician Class she studied and became N7ZJY on June 30, 1992. Interestingly enough it was Sally who gave Warren N7YRN the idea to get his Ham license.

Actually one cannot know Sally without knowing her close friend and companion Warren. They had known each other for quite a while before Warren became a widower some 17 years ago and Sally divorced. They became closer friends through the Senior Citizen activities in Cheney and now share a good earl of time each day.

These days Sally has difficulties with dimming vision and arthritis which limit her mobility and activities. And -Oh Yesthe "Bridgett Report"! As most of you know Bridgett is a Ferret that Sally has had form some time and is happy, healthy and a little bit spoiled.


#### KBARA Membership/Support Information

The KBARA system consists of several amateur radio repeaters that are linked together to cover an area from southeastern British Columbia to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system can also be connected to the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in the northwestern United States and Western Canada.

The primary purpose of the KBARA system is to function as a linked system that provides communications to and within the above area. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage extending beyond the limited range of provided by any single repeater operation.

FM repeaters operating in the VHF and UHF bands are linked by full duplex UHF radios. The repeaters frequencies and locations are as follows:

147.380 W7OE, Mica Peak, East of Spokane, WA
147.360 KB7WTO, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain, N of Spokane
147.280 AA7P, Pikes Peak, southeast of Walla Walla, WA
147.020 N7LVO, Lookout Pass, on the Idaho Montana border
147.740 KB7ARA, Kamiak Butte, near Colfas and Pullman WA
145.010 WB7AUK Packet Node & BBS, Mica Peak E. of Spokane
223.900 WA7YCP, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain N. of Spokane
