Beyond The Call by Dennis N7UTM

Recently at one of the breakfasts at "Doodles" I heard an interesting story about an assault rifle. It got me thinking (dangerous sometimes) and led me to this story. KD7DDQ Ken Crosswhite was born February 15th 1940 at Eldorado Springs, Missouri. He is the first child of five having three younger sisters and a brother who is the youngest. A span of 12 years between them. His father worked in

aircraft design for a company that was eventually absorbed by Boeing. In 1948 his father moved the family to California where he became a building contractor.

Ken graduated from Fullerton California High School in 1959 and worked at several jobs before enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1961. He reenlisted in 1964 for two more years with the promise of some education help, but the Vietnam war heated up and Ken was sent over there for 13 months instead. (here comes the story) One day when Ken was accompanying a group of South Vietnamese soldiers in the bush he got shot in the leg! Returning the fire he took out the Viet Cong soldier who had hit him and was able to the VC's AK47. Before leaving Vietnam he was able to keep the weapon by disassembling it and shipping it back to the US in pieces. (against regulations) Sergeant Crosswhite was awarded the Purple Heart, was discharged and had to spend quite a bit of time recovering from his wound. Ken made a display case with the rifle, his medal and other awards as well as items of pride, such as photos of motorcycles and hot rods and it became a "conversation starter" in his home. Sadly the display and all the contents were stolen about 5 years ago and non of it has been recovered.

It took some months for full recovery and eventually Ken lost his veteran's benefits. So he became a long haul truck driver for four years, from 1973 to 1977. He then worked a number of auto mechanic jobs in California. He customized and rebuilt engines and made general repairs. He heard from a friend about the opportunities in Spokane and moved here only to find the job market slim and fell into self employment as a mechanic. Ken worked as a body and fender person until, recently, he found out his health could not tolerate the paint and other chemical fumes. At this time Ken is planning on going back to school at SCC and work for a degree in electronics. He'll start this fall.

Ken was married for about seven years and has been single since 1987. He has one son (19) who lives with him at their Millwood home. Although Ken used CB as a trucker this did not lead him directly to Ham Radio as it did for so many others. He saw a notice at Albertsons about KJ7YX holding technician license classes, so he attended Scott's classes and earned his Tech License in October of 1998. Since then he has really immersed himself into amateur radio and has been able to progress through "bootleg general" to Amateur Extra in April of 2001. Ken is most friendly and is willing to help others with repairs, loans of radio gear and other types of assistance. Ken has certainly enlivened various KBARA meetings and campouts with his burger barbecue contest and those FAMOUS squirrel potluck meals! He also does a great job as "netcontrol" for the KBARA weekly nets on Wednesday night. So here's wishing Ken the best of luck in his efforts for college and hope his "homework and other work doesn't keep him off the air too much. We need that ready laugh and sure fire sense of humor.

to establish a reliable link from KBARA to the Southern Interior Repeater Group; KBARA participated with five other clubs in hosting the 2000 Spokane Hamfest, and was active with Spokane Hamfest 2001; the Club was present at several Hamfests; KB7ARA hosted its second annual Field Day at Pioneer Park near Dayton, WA; KB7ARA QSL cards were designed by Mike, N1NG and Ruth, KD7EWV; a second KBARA website was made available to the club by the new Spokane Representative, Mike, N1NG; two new nets debuted - the Road Runners' and Whitman/Latah County ARES Nets; and Charlene, KC7RQF, became the Southern Representative, while Ken, KD7DDQ, became the Wednesday Evening Net Manager. John, W7OE, Karl, WA7YCP, Royal, KB7WTO, Bob, KC7HFI, and Walt and Charlene, W7ALT and KC7RQF, presented reports on the status of the repeater system. A report given by Mike, N1NG, the Spokane Representative was followed by the Net Managers' reports from Tom, KK7PX, Jeremiah, KD7DMP and Ken, KD7DDQ, with more participation in the nets being urged. The Members approved again having Field Day 2002 at Pioneer Park near Dayton, WA, with Ruth, KD7EWV, graciously agreeing, to again head up that committee The North Country Representatives, Roy and Jan, VE7DTT and VE7TST, reviewed the Southern Interior

Repeater Group's link to KBARA. The Members next approved KBARA's \$500 seed money donation to the Spokane Hamfest 2001. Last, was a brief discussion about intentional radio interference.

Under "New Business", the Members approved KBARA's donation of \$300 to the Evergreen Intertie, to be applied toward site rental at Mt. Baldy, the link between Naneum Ridge and Tiger Mountain. The project, when completed, will allow repeaters to be linked to the Internet via telephone lines, ultimately supplying users communication with a vast selection of worldwide nodes. The Members voted to include this node as part of KBARA and to pay for the Digital Subscriber Telephone Line, approximately \$40 per month, when the project is functional and is linked to the KBARA system. Members recognized Mike, N1NG for his service to the Club. The elections followed: elected, as President was Betsy, N7WRQ; Vice President, Bob, KC7HFI; Secretary, Barbara, KB7WTN; and Treasurer, Neil, N7LVO. The meeting was then adjourned.


KBARA Membership/Support Information

The KBARA system consists of several amateur radio repeaters that are linked together to cover an area from southeastern British Columbia to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system can also be connected to the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in the northwestern United States and Western Canada.

The primary purpose of the KBARA system is to function as a linked system that provides communications to and within the above area. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage extending beyond the limited range of provided by any single repeater operation.

FM repeaters operating in the VHF and UHF bands are linked by full duplex UHF radios. The repeaters frequencies and locations are as follows:

147.380 W7OE, Mica Peak, East of Spokane, WA
147.360 KB7WTO, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain, N of Spokane
147.280 AA7P, Pikes Peak, southeast of Walla Walla, WA
147.020 N7LVO, Lookout Pass, on the Idaho Montana border
147.740 KB7ARA, Kamiak Butte, near Colfas and Pullman WA
145.010 WB7AUK Packet Node & BBS, Mica Peak E. of Spokane
223.900 WA7YCP, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain N. of Spókane
