THE KAMIAK BUTTE AMATEUR REPEATER ASSOCIATION

The KBARA system consists of several amateur radio repeaters that are linked together to cover an area from southeastern British Columbia to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system can also be connected to the Evergreen Intertie (http://www.evergreenintertie.com), and interconnected group of repeaters located in the northwestern United States and western Canada. The primary purpose of the KBARA system is to function as a linked system that provides emergency communications to and within the above area. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage extending beyond the limited range provided by any single repeater operation.

FM repeaters operating in the VHF and UHF bands are linked by full duplex UHF radios. The repeaters' frequencies and locations are as follows:

147.380 W7OE, Mica Peak, east of Spokane, WA 147.360 KB7WTO, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain, north of Spokane, WA

147.280 W7ALT, Pikes Peak, southeast of Walla Walla, WA

147.020 N7LVO, Lookout Pass, on the Idaho-Montana border

146.740 KC7HFI, Kamiak Butte, near Colfax and Pullman, WA

223.900 WA7YCP, Stensgar (Stranger) Mountain, north of Spokane, WA

Annual Meeting Minutes, June 29, 2002, 3:00PM

Bowl and Pitcher Group Camp Ground, Riverside State Park, WA

The meeting began with a call to order, and the introduction of officers, appointed officials, and owners.

Under "Old Business", the minutes of the June 30, 2001 annual meeting, published in the Summer issue of the KBARA Gazette, were approved by the Members. Neil, N7LVO, presented the Treasurer's report, and a full accounting would be published in the next KBARA newsletter. Several owners commented on recent developments to the repeater system. John, W7OE, Bob, KC7HFI, and Charlene, KC7RQF, gave accounts of the new solid-state two meter equipment soon to be installed on Stensgar Mt., the upcoming July 20 tour of the Kamiak Butte repeater, and the Pike's Peak newly refurbished equipment recently moved to the top of the hill. Next, the North Country Representative, Roy, VE7DTT, described the severe lightning damage received by the Oliver A.R.C. repeater equipment at Mt. Baldy, B.C. That repeater is KBARA's link to the Southern Interior Repeater Group, and the Internet Radio Linking Project. Net Managers' reports from Ken, KD7DDQ, and Jeremiah, KD7DMP, included urging for more participation in the nets. The Members next approved KBARA's \$500 seed money donation to the Spokane Hamfest 2002.

Under "New Business", the Members approved KBARA's donation of \$100 to the Evergreen Intertie, to be applied toward site rental at Mt. Baldy, WA, the link between Naneum Ridge and Tiger Mountain, contingent upon the link's resumption of service. Also, an approved donation of \$200 would be given to the Oliver A.R.C. toward equipment repairs. Next, the Members showed their appreciation to those who donated equipment to be sold for benefit of the Club: to Gene, WA7PUD, Warren, N7YRN, Bob, KC7HFI, and Ken, W7KLL. Next, amendments were made to the Standing Rules. Section V. Association Officers, part A. was approved to read: "Bank checking account requires signatures of any two of the following: the elected officials or the Technical Director." Previously, that section read: "Checking account requires two signatures: President and one other, either the Treasurer or Technical Director." Also section VI. Duties of Officers and Committees, part E. was approved to read: "Technical Director shall be John P. Dempster, W7OE, so long as he shall be the majority owner of the repeaters being supported by Kamiak Butte Amateur Repeater Association." Previously, that section read: "Technical Director shall be Arthur A. Gemmrig, Sr. WB7AUK so long as he shall be the owner of the repeaters being supported by Kamiak Butte Amateur Repeater Association." Lifetime memberships in the Club were granted to Jim, N7WRR, and Betsy, N7WRQ. The elections followed: elected as President was Bob, KC7HFI; Vice President, Ken, W7KLL; Secretary, Barbara, KB7WTN; and Treasurer, Neil, N7LVO. The meeting was then adjourned.
