Here's the story on Spokane Hamfest 2008: 523 in attendance, the second highest after Hamfest 1995; profit \$2,622 (2006 was the highest at \$3,192) with return on seed money of 131%; prize money spent \$2,300 (the most

ever); swap tables sold 39 (much lower than normal.....we've been running around 50 in recent year) And finally, the group unanimously agreed to hold next year's ARRL WA State Convention, pending League approval, on September 26, 2009, at University High School, with prices all staying the same, with the treasury functions flowing through the IEVHF club's bank account. Dave, K7DWB, has graciously agreed to preside over the Treasury functions again, and yours truly will guide the tiller. KBARA Membership / Support Information

The KBARA repeater system consists of several privately owned linked Amateur Radio repeaters. It covers an area from northeastern Washington to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system is also part of the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in western Washington and Oregon. The primary purpose of the KBARA repeaters is to provide a means for emergency communications within the above areas, and secondarily for routine radio traffic. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage, extending the limited range provided by any single repeater operation.

The KBARA FM repeaters operate in the VHF bands and are linked by UHF radios. The repeaters' frequencies, call signs, locations and owners are as follows:
