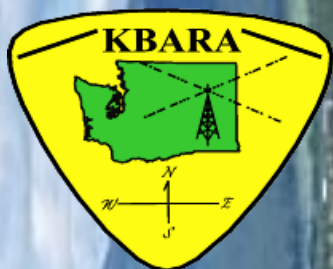

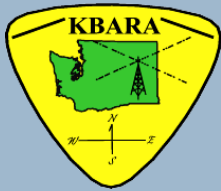

46th Spokane Hamfest & ARRL WA State Convention

The 46th Spokane Hamfest & ARRL WA State Convention has come & gone. Hosted by six clubs at Horizon Middle School in the Spokane Valley, it was attended by some 454, had 80 swap/commercial/info tables, 10 seminars, license testing, door prizes, food, & most importantly camaraderie. Technical Update

The KBARA system is working fairly well at this time but work remains to be done. The 147.38 still has a long tail caused by traffic coming in from the hub at Stensgar and the West Twin repeater is currently down.

The BEARS repeater 145.33 on Tiger Mountain that covers the Puget Sound area is up and going and linked into the KBARA system full time via AllStar. So we once again have cross state coverage. Thanks to Don W7VXS, Dan AA7JP and the other members of BEARS for all the work on the Tiger Mountain repeater and linking us in!

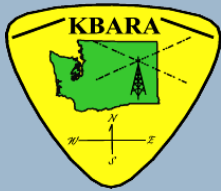
Lookout Pass, MT 147.02 repeater. Is still working fine after I replaced the Kenwood TKR-750 repeater with the Icom FR-5000 repeater. The link interference is almost non-existent now and performing well.

Pikes Peak, OR 147.28 repeater. The Pikes Peak 147.28 repeater has been working fine since the work Betsy N7WRQ and I did last December.

Mica Peak 147.38 repeater. Mica Peak repeater and link was working well after Keira KI7GUB and I installed the ice shield above the link antenna in December. However the link to the hub went down in March. Mike KJ7ZXF and I went to Mica site March 17th and found another tenant's debris had fallen on the feed line to the link antenna, putting a sharp bend in the coax and stressing the antenna which was pointing downward. We found a 3:1 SWR from the damaged feed line and antenna. We loosened the feed line as much as we could and pointed the antenna back, and I increased power on the link radio from 5 to 15 watts to keep the link working until I could return with new feed line. Jim W7JJR and I returned to site on May 5th and installed 75' of new feed line. We found the N socket on the antenna was damaged some, but were able to get it to work. With the new feed line the SWR is now back down to 1:1 from 3:1. The link radio wasn't transmitting so replaced it and set it at 5 watts and installed a new shielded controller cable. All seemed to be working when we left site, however it turned out that 147.38 was getting out through IRLP, but 147.38 and 147.36 were not talking with each other. I returned to site on May 7th and found a programming error with the link radio. All is working well now. A big thanks to Mike KJ7ZXF and Jim W7JJR for the help at Mica Peak. Stensgar 147.36 repeater. The repeater still drops out or stops transmitting on occasion when someone is transmitting directly into it. It is not a time-out; the repeater just stops transmitting, but it is still receiving and passing audio through the hub. Once the transmitting station unkeys for 2 or 3 seconds, the repeater resets and will transmit again. I have a different isolator I will try to install this summer and see if that will fix it.

Hopefully this will be enough to fix the issues at site and get it back on the air again.

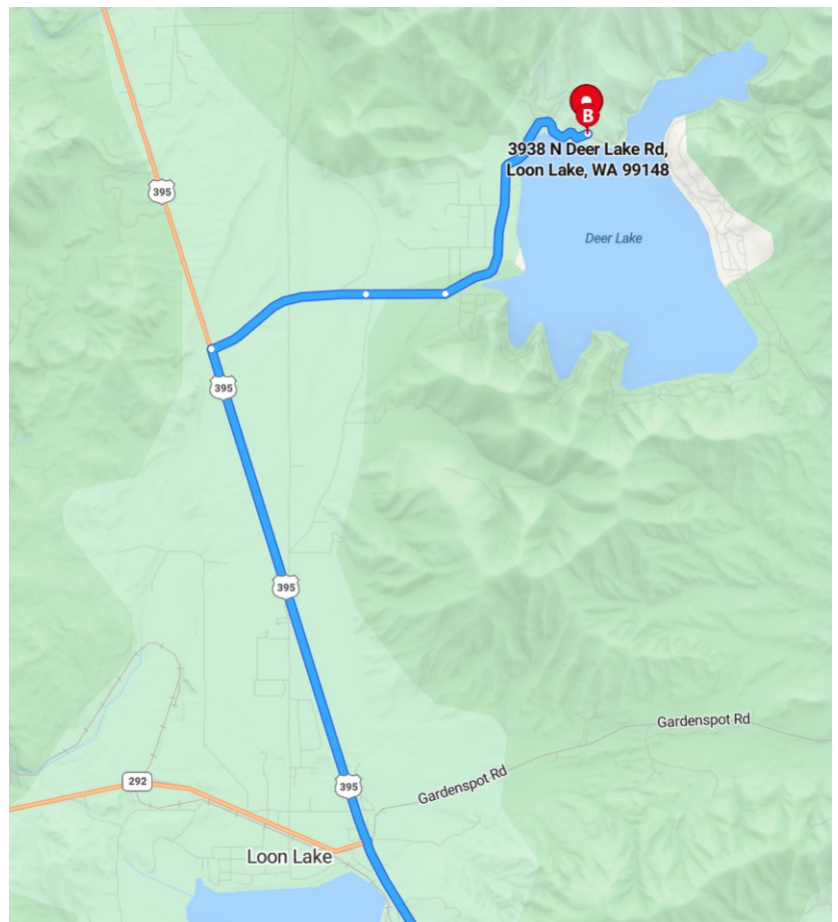

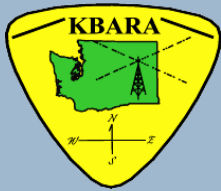

Field Day is coming!

When: Saturday June 28 - Sunday 29

Where: Valleyford Community Park, 11418 E Palouse Highway, Valleyford, WA

Field Day is the single most popular on-the-air event held annually in the U.S. and Canada. More than 40,000 hams will be setting up temporary stations.

KBARA Field Day will be a casual, social event rather than being contest oriented. It will be a time to gather with people you may only know from on-air visits. We will operate 3 or 4 stations at any given time and you are encouraged to bring your own equipment if you want to test it out in an off-grid situation. All stations will be battery or generator powered.

On-air operations will start at 11:00 am local time (1800 UTC) and run for 24 hours. We will start setting up stations as early as anyone wants to get there – probably 8 or 9 am.

On Saturday there will be a potluck mid-day meal. Betsy, N7WRQ, will be organizing that. She and Jim will provide German sausages/buns/condiments. Everyone else please bring salads, hot dishes, etc. to round out the meal. The coffee pot will always be on. We do have electricity at the covered pavilion.

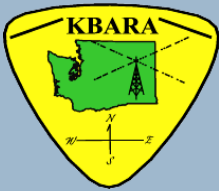
If you plan to stay into the night or all night bring whatever other nourishment you may want. Jim, KM7H plans to prepare a breakfast on Sunday for the hardy souls who are there overnight.

Tim, N6JXN, will be point man for radios and antennas. If you plan to bring equipment please let him know. During the event we can change out the equipment at various stations so you have a chance to test out your own setup. Jim, N7WRR, and Jim, KM7H will bring generators/inverters. Others are welcome to bring yours. To be in accord with the rules batteries cannot be recharged on the electrical grid so we can do that via solar or generator.

We will need some tables, chairs, canopies, etc for the operating stations. Contact Jim, KM7H, if you want to help with that.

Jim, W7JJR, is going to do some social media promotion for us but if you know any ham wannabes encourage them to come on out.

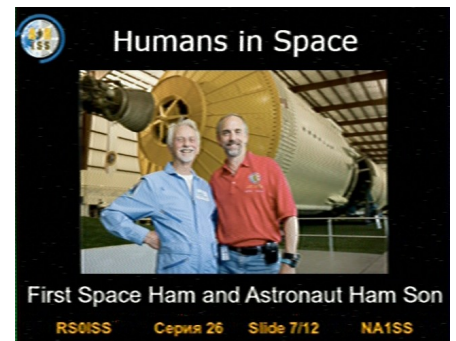

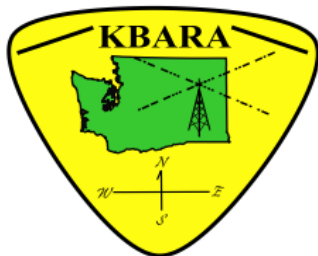

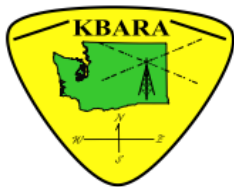

The KBARA system is also part of the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in western Washington and Oregon. The primary purpose of the KBARA repeaters is to provide a means for emergency communications within the above areas, and secondarily for routine radio traffic. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage, extending the limited range provided by any single repeater operation. The KBARA FM repeaters operate in the VHF bands and are linked by UHF radios, IRLP, EchoLink KB7ARA-R, and AllStar node 53587. The repeaters' frequencies, call signs and locations are as follows:

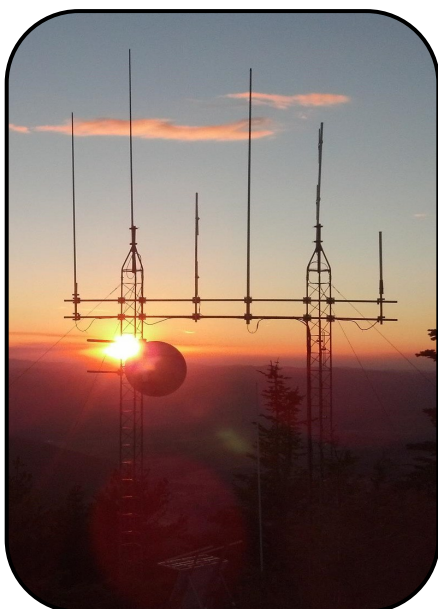

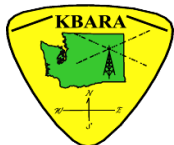
